Thanks to your support, we deepened our impact across our region. Together, through partnerships and the spirit of collaboration from 3,431 donors, 311 corporate/workplace partners, 78 non-profits, and 5,832 volunteers, we made a \$2.6 MILLION impact in our community! More importantly, we changed the lives of 56,373 people across Okaloosa and Walton counties. Whether through grant funding, direct services, or boots-on-the-ground volunteerism, this community showed up for our neighbors.

A growing highlight of our work is our leadership in grant management and non-profit capacity-building. Local funders including CHELCO Foundation, Eglin Federal Credit Union, Forever Warriors powered by Step One Automotive Group, and Emerald Coast Community Wellness Foundation entrusted us to streamline their investments. We've built unique relationships with each of them, tailored to their individual goals, and worked together to ensure every dollar goes further and non-profits have the support they need to thrive. These partnerships reflect the confidence our community has in UWEC's ability to deliver results with integrity, efficiency, and impact. And that humbles me to my core.

We also expanded our initiatives including our ALICE Simulations, which opened hearts and minds to the daily struggles of hardworking families, and ProjectLEAD, preparing individuals to make meaningful contributions on local boards of directors. In partnership with the Early Learning Coalition, we built new Born Learning Trails, creating free, engaging learning opportunities for local children. And our Change Starts With U podcast continued to share inspiring, behind-the-scenes stories from the people and partners driving real change.

This year, we again celebrated an incredible milestone: a record-breaking 17,135 volunteer hours, thanks to dedicated supporters who power everything from ReadingPals to Day of Caring, Women United, NextGen United (formerly Emerging Leaders), Retire United, and more.

We are proud to maintain the highest accreditations from United Way Worldwide, Charity Navigator, Candid, BBB Wise Giving Alliance, and Service Enterprise Certification - the only non-profit in the Emerald Coast to have earned these distinctions! These recognitions reflect our deep commitment to transparency, accountability, and operational excellence.

None of this would be possible without our extraordinary team. The passion, creativity, and dedication of our staff and our amazing Board of Directors is what makes our mission come alive every single day. While we experienced some transitions this year, we remained united in our purpose and true to our mission of uniting people with resources to improve the quality of life in Okaloosa and Walton counties. Empowering ALICE FAMILIES

ALICE* (Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed) is our neighbor, family member, and friend.

These low-wage workers earn too little to afford the basics yet too much for government support.

UWEC believes every working family should be able to save for emergencies, access quality healthcare, and achieve their potential. With your support, we're building a future where ALICE* moves from surviving to thriving. ALICE households earn above the federal poverty level, but below the real cost of living. ALICE includes our junior enlisted airmen struggling to adjust to a new community, seniors choosing between food and medication, and families finding it nearly impossible to keep up with rising prices. ALICE is our family members, our friends, and our neighbors.

ALICE is the reason UWEC works collaboratively to close the gap between what people are earning and the cost of living. We hope every family, in every ZIP code in Okaloosa and Walton counties, can thrive.







of Okaloosa and Walton County households are ALICE.

They live paycheck to paycheck, just one unexpected expense away from crisis.



47% work full-time and 12% work part-time 39% are retired or not in the workforce 2% are unemployed

Megan, Jio, and their newborn are one of many ALICE families - working households struggling to afford basic needs. After being kicked out of a relative's home, they had no income, few options, and a baby on the way. Thanks to a UWEC-funded partner, they found safe shelter, healthy food, and a fresh start. Jio found work, Megan had a healthy pregnancy, and today they're rebuilding their lives with stability and forward momentum. Their story is a powerful reminder of what's possible when ALICE families get the support they need.

The minimum cost to live in the current economy - a bare-bones budget for just the necessities. Above are the budgets for a single household, a family of 4 (1 in childcare, 1 in school), and a senior in Okaloosa and Walton counties.

Born Learning Trails are a series of 10 interactive games for young children marked by engaging instructional signs. The trails turn a trip to the park into an active learning experience, helping children develop skills for school readiness. We have 9 Born Leaning Trails throughout Okaloosa and Walton counties.



ReadingPals is an early literacy initiative focused on supporting children in VPK & preschool. We proudly host this program in partnership with The Children's Movement of Florida.

Our program matches trained volunteers with 140 children to work on early literacy skills and social-emotional development during school hours or after-school care.
